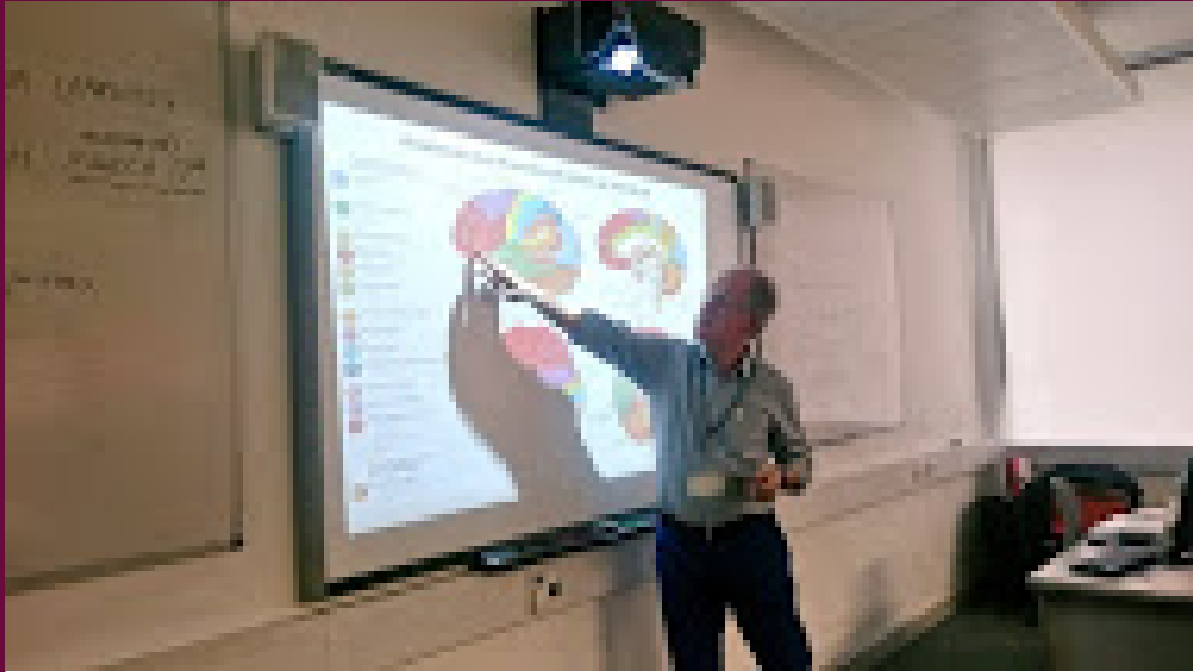

STEM ambassadors visiting STEM club



STEM club at Chelsea Academy takes place every Thursday after school. Recently we have had two STEM ambassadors visit STEM club to talk about their work.

On 3rd March, neuroscientist Dr Paul Winter spoke to students about the anatomy of the brain, and the previous week Dr Gruppetta talked to our students about optics and how to build microscopes. Look out for special STEM club activities during British Science Week @ Chelsea, including Dr Greene dissecting a shark on 10th March, and another STEM ambassador visiting on 17th March.

Year 10 Science Projects



For the last two weeks, Year 10 students have been preparing Science projects on topics of their choice. These have covered all areas of Science, from looking at different hair types under the microscope, to the effect of different foods on our urine, and the electromagnetic effect. AS level Biology trip to Juniper Hall



At the start of February, all the Year 12 Biology students went on a 3 day residential trip to Juniper Hall field studies centre on Boxhill in Surrey. The purpose of the trip was for students to practise their practical Biology skills, and tools for analysing different environments. Students did several different studies, including a river study and setting humane mammal traps to study the local wildlife.

Project D – MRI Research



Since January, twelve Year 10 students have been taking part in Project D, a project with Dr Andy Scott from The Royal Brompton Hospital. The aim of the project is to involve students in a hands on project using MRI, which should lead to increased uptake into further education in science subjects. Students were selected based on their written applications, and so far have attended workshops at the hospital and in the Academy, including using the MRI scanner. The students will hopefully be presenting their findings at the 2016 Imperial Festival in May, held at Imperial College.

Imperial College trip for A level Chemistry students



All twenty Year 13 Chemistry students visited the Reach Out lab at Imperial with Miss Edge, Dr Doyle and Mrs Holgate for a workshop on Spectroscopic techniques. We had two and a half hours using IR and NMR spectroscopy to analyse different compounds and identify them. Whilst we were there, Professor Robert Winston stopped by and had a chat with our students as they worked – giving advice about university and careers in sciences. Everyone had a great morning!



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
