
Paranormal





And somehow impossible though it seems they may still be alive.


Fantasy







Horror






Romance

Yet when Xiomara sits next to Aman in science class, she can't deny the attraction – and starts to question why she would want to. At the same time, a new teacher at school starts a slam poetry club, and Xiomara's notebook, filled with the poetry she is too shy to share with anyone, yearns to be shouted, sung, confessed.



Rosie is devastated when circumstances separate her from her boyfriend Jack. She resolves to find him, whatever it takes. Even if this means running away from home without telling her parents, and travelling alone to Brighton. 
Dystopia


Classics








Graphic Novels





And then the boat he manages to find passage on (for a small fortune) is a small six-person rubber dinghy, now carrying 14 passengers...

But Astrid loves Roller Derby: she wants to be just like Rainbow Bite, the best and most awesome jammer she's ever seen.
