The Chelsea Academy Foundation (CAF) supports an array of programmes to ensure that students at Chelsea Academy have opportunities to flourish by broadening their horizons, narrowing the attainment and social mobility gap, and encouraging students to fulfil their overall potential.

## Our Students



While the Academy is in RBKC, many students come from our feeder school located in one of the 10% most deprived areas in the country and 33.39% of our students are eligible for the Pupil Premium grant.

During 2022-23, 40% of Chelsea Academy students were eligible for free school meals compared to the national average of 23.8%

Over 47% of Chelsea Academy students have English as an Additional Language compared to the national average of 18%.

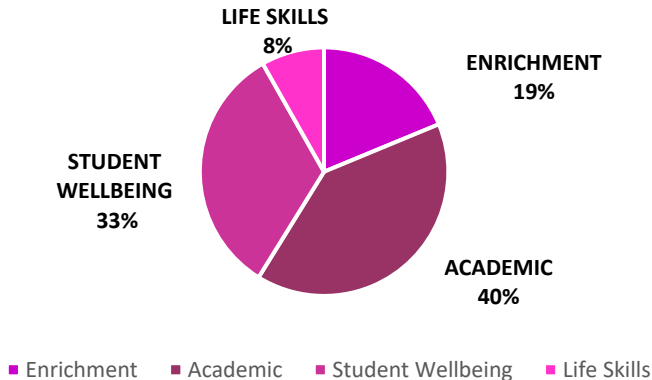

## Our Results

### Participation

- Over 725 student experiences delivered through CAF funding
- Over 450 in-house counselling sessions provided to over 90 students
- 101 students took part in the Duke of Edinburgh Awards
- 180 Y11 students received GCSE revision books in all GCSE subjects

### GCSE

- 61% of our students achieved Grade 5 or above in English and Maths in 2023 (National Average, 45%)
- In 2022, over 25% of all grades awarded were Grade 7 or higher

### A Level

- Top 10% of state secondary schools nationally for A Level progress in 2019 (when last reported)
- In 2022, one-third of all A Levels graded A\* to A and almost 60% of all qualifications graded A\* to B
