Our Students

Chelsea Academy serves over 1,100 students from Year 7 to Year 13, with 44.8% eligible for the Pupil Premium grant and 43.6% receiving free school meals—significantly above the national average of 24.6%. Nearly half (48%) of students have English as an Additional Language, compared to the

national average of 18.6%.


Our Results

Participation

- Four programmes are available to all students: Digital Theatre, Voice 21
 Oracy, Place2Be and the Breakfast Programme.
- Over 1,400 student opportunities delivered in addition to programmes available to all students.
- Over 300 in-house counselling sessions provided to over 75 students.
- 84 students did the Duke of Edinburgh Awards with 14 at the Gold Level.
- 180 Y11 students received GCSE revision books in all GCSE subjects.

Our Investment by Programme Type

£193,000 invested in 38 programmes



Did You Know?

- Launched in February 2024, the Breakfast Programme has seen participation double to over 100 students per day by June 2024.
- The Foundation has a **hardship fund** available to help students who may need financial assistance during the academic year.
- Over 50 volunteers have helped the Foundation deliver Life Skills events.

Academic Results

- 54.5% of our GCSE students achieved Grade 5 or above in English and Maths in 2024 (National Average, 45.9%).
- Chelsea Academy ranks in the top 25% of state secondary schools nationally, based on its Progress 8 score.
- 19% of all A Levels graded A* to A; 48% of all qualifications graded A* to B.
